## *From the Senior Warden:*

The vestry and I are pleased to announce that as of Sunday, July 14, 2019, Reverend Canon Elizabeth Habecker ("Reverend Liz") will be joining St. Thomas' as our interim rector, serving us through (tentatively) the end of November. Although it had previously been announced that Rev. Liz would begin at St. Thomas' on August 1, a change in her schedule has allowed her to join us a few weeks earlier than planned.

As things stand now, Rev. Liz will conduct the Sunday Eucharists and will have office hours on Wednesdays. The vestry continues to discuss how to handle Saturday services, and it has been proposed that they consist of Evening Prayer, with inclusion of Celtic service themes. Father Don will continue to celebrate the Healing Services on Wednesday mornings. If changes occur, parishioners will be notified through the Newsletter and Constant Contact.

A proud native of New Jersey, I was born and raised in Montclair, New Jersey. My University days were spent in Ohio, where I lived afterward and taught high school English.

When I made the decision to seek to serve the Episcopal Church as an ordained minister, it was at the beginning of the new opportunity for women to be ordained to the priesthood. In 1977 I was among the first women to be ordained, at the Cathedral in Portland, Maine. I have led congregations in Maine, New Jersey, and California.

I have three children. Sarah and her family live in Arizona, Bill lives in Los Angeles (but wants to move to Bristol!), and Katie lives in Yarmouth, Maine. I am thrilled to be the grandmother of six and great-grandmother of two!

After serving the church in the Diocese of Los Angeles for over 20 years, I retired in 2013 and moved back to the East Coast. I am happily a resident of Bristol, RI. As a sign in one of the shops there reads, "I wasn't born in Bristol, but I got here as soon as I could." I very much enjoy being part of this community and hope to be an active resident for many years.
